Plateau - Serving the Llano Estacado and Beyond

Begin in 1949 as the Eastern New Mexico Rural (ENMR) Telephone Cooperative, Plateau now provides long distance service, business solutions, and high-speed fiber-optic Internet and television, serving 25,000 square miles. 95% of that coverage includes DSL.

To serve the demands of a faster-paced society, Plateau has invested in fiber-optic cabling and modern networking equipment. Rural communities have more choices than ever before. Every school in Plateau's service area has fiber, as does every medical facility, library, public safety and government building. Plateau has built a high capacity middle mile network which includes 672 anchor

institutions and a presence in major POP's such as Albuquerque, Santa Fe, El Paso, Amarillo and Lubbock.

Plateau provides voice services for business and residential customers; advanced data services for business and residential customers over fiber, copper and fixed wireless; and dedicated data circuits up to 10 Gbps (larger circuits can be accommodated by special request).

Today the company is providing the first residential Gigabit service in New Mexico. It is available in the following cities: Clovis, Roswell, Tucumcari, Las Vegas, Edgewood, Moriarty, Estancia, Mountainair, Belen and Los Lunas. For more information:www.plateaufiber.com

Tim is a veteran of EDD and the Community, Business & Rural Development Team. He has worked in several regions and currently makes his home in Springer, where he has an office provided by the community. Since joining EDD Tim has been involved in a variety of



community and business development projects. He has friends in every town he serves. They will tell you that, regardless of what you ask of him, Tim will find a way to help.

Tim is a history buff. He owns and lives in the Mills Mansion in Springer. One project he is especially proud of is the sale and future renovation of the historic Casteñada Hotel in Las Vegas because it has such great potential for the state and city. The Castañeda was completed in 1898 by Fred Harvey, and was the first of the Harvey House chain of hotels. It has been closed for about four decades. In the days of train travel, La Castañeda, the Alvarado (in Albuquerque) and El Tovar, at the Grand Canyon, were the flagship hotels of the Southwest.

In 2014 La Castañeda and the Plaza Hotel were sold to Allan Affeldt, who restored [La Posada](#) in Winslow, Arizona. Tim spent many months working with the City of Las Vegas to identify a funding source for the project. When New Mexico programs were not a fit, California New Market Tax Credits provided the solution. Construction will begin in September with \$9 million in funding from Clearinghouse CDFI of California.

As a rural economic development professional, Tim likes to talk about succession planning with the businesses he serves. These types of conversations led to the expansion of Mesa Pharmacy to Springer. Filling

prescriptions can be challenging in remote areas.

In a similar fashion, Tim helped Terry Kear, a longtime employee of Springer Ford, open his own auto service business. Terry's business will create five new jobs in Springer.

Need a destination? Check out [Off the Road New Mexico](#), a unique resource to increase visitors and promote the historic and cultural attractions in 27 MainStreet and eight Arts & Cultural Districts.

Developed by New Mexico MainStreet, the website suggests weekend trips to explore our communities. The website is a one-stop source for planning cultural excursions. It features rich content created by a team of experts in historic preservation, tourism, and urban and community planning, who worked with each community to identify cultural and historic sites.

A map feature divides the state into nine distinct geographic regions. Visitors interested in topics such as historic theaters, courthouses, or Victorian architecture, can search the website by subject. There are more than 250 listings that are searchable using content categories such as Civic Buildings or Historic Hotels. The website also allows visitors to select from more than 20 architectural styles including Art Deco, Pueblo, or WPA styles.
